The name of Microbiologics product 0184 (ATCC Licensed Derivative® ATCC® 33389™*) has been changed from *Haemophilus aphrophilus* to *Aggregatibacter aphrophilus*. ATCC® reported to Microbiologics that the name of ATCC® 33389™* was changed because, based on genetic studies, it was proposed and accepted that this strain belongs to the genus *Aggregatibacter* and the species *aphrophilus*.
